





Per Memorandum COP #06-436 and ACI #06-128, I have been ordered to provide copies and information regarding Dennis Regan and incidents related to "Dukes Tire" on 13th Street.

March 15, 2006, Dennis Regan called Zone 3 station and spoke with my clerk, and requested I call him regarding the "tire business on 13th." (See attached note)

March 15, 2006, 1504 hours, I returned Mr. Regan's call and was put through to his voicemail system. (See attached note.)

March 15, 2006, 1538 hours, I again attempted to reach Mr. Regan and spoke with his secretary who stated, "She checked with Mr. Regan and he would call me back." (See attached note.)

April 27, 2006, 1040 hours, I received an email from my clerk, Patty Carlin, requesting I call the station. (See attached email.)

April 27, 2006, 1050 hours, I called Zone 3 Station and Officer Christine Luffey #3418 stated that she had been ordered by Dennis Regan of the Mayor's Office to deliver the following message, "Dukes Tire has friends in the Mayor's office, and he has no problem with him changing tires in the street and I was to leave them alone." Mr. Regan continued that if I did not get with the program, I would be walking a beat." Additionally, he had attended an Arlington Block Watch meeting and no officer was present. He further stated that Commander Brackney was to personally attend the meetings, and if she did not, she should remember that "shit rolls down hill."


April 28, 2006, Officer Christine Luffey submitted a memo regarding Mr. Regan's visit. (See attached.)


April 29, 2006, Officer Andrew Jones #3521 called Zone 3 and indicated he had witnessed the above events and submitted the attached special through his chain of command. (See attached special.)


May 9, 2006, 1400 hours, I attended a meeting with the Mount Washington Development Corporation in Dennis Regan's office. The following persons were present Dennis Regan, François L'Hereux, Sandra L'Hereux, Ethan Raup, Representative Michael Divens, Director Guy Costa, Councilman Dan Deasy, and Former Police Chief Dominic Costa. The meeting was adjourned and as I stepped from the office into the hallway, Mr. Regan followed behind and confronted me. He then stated, "Do you have a problem with Duke's Tire?" I responded that I did not know understand the nature of his question. He again asked, "If I had a problem with Duke's Tire and the way they operate? I informed him that I would not allow any business to operate illegally. Mr. Regan went on to say they had been in business for 30 years, and who was I to tell them they could not operate their business on the city streets. I explained that it was illegal, and they were not exempt from operating within the perimeters of the law. Mr. Regan then said, "I've had enough of you." He opened the door into his office and yelled back to former Chief Dominic Costa. "Dom, I have a problem with your Commander, and you better start handling her."

I have included the specials from the above officers, my clerk, Celeste Yoverich, and other relevant emails regarding the above incidents.
